1.	I am a resident ofCounty.			
2.	I have enough room in my home for another child. Unless a child is 2 years or younger, each foster and birth child must have his/her own space and bed. A child from foster care may share a room with another foster child or your child, but never with an adult: 18 years or older. Further, no adult may move out of a bedroom in order to make room for a child in foster care; each adult must have an assigned room apart from the foster child's own room.			
3.	I have adequate income to meet my current family's needs. Candidate Resource family must have a stable source of income (TANF does not qualify as a stable income). During your family assessment, you will be asked to provide verification of your income. NOTE: All Resource and adoptive parents are reimbursed for the care they provide a child.			
4.	I am able to meet the physical and emotional demands of being a parent. Being a parent, especially to children in foster care, can be physically and emotionally challenging and it's important to be in good health and have an adequate support system. You will be asked to take a physical exam and complete interviews conducted by a social worker.			
*5.	I have received supervision or services from DCFS or another child protective agency. Any record related to child abuse or neglect allegations, will affect candidacy as a resource parent. Each case will be carefully reviewed.			
6.	I have never been out of compliance for child support payments. If you have been out of compliance, for child support payments, you must disclose and discuss it with a social worker on an individual basis.			
7.	No adult or child in my home has a current open criminal case or is on parole or probation. Furthermore, no one in my home has been convicted of Crimes Against Children or Domestic Violence. If so, such items must be disclosed and discussed with a social worker before the process can be moved forward.
